



# **Chapter House Update**

Over the course of the school year that just concluded, a great deal of work and research has been put toward the formal reinstitution of the Housing Corporation. Being that it has been inactive since the mid-1990's, this effort has been a high priority of the Alumni Chapter as currently there is no sustainable means to ensure the wellbeing of the house. With the help of local alumni brothers in the community and beyond, the Alumni Chapter has been able to recruit volunteers to serve as the first members of the board since it was dissolved. This is a huge step forward, not only as a means to further cultivate the bonds between the Chapter and the alumni community, but because it signals the beginning of a new stage in the life of the House and the Epsilon Sigma Chapter. Estimates for projects of immediate need have been identified and obtained from local contractors so that change can be made as soon as our fundraising goals have been met. I am very excited for this new development and am confident that the members of the Housing Corporation will be successful in partnering with the Active Chapter to preserve the integrity of the House for vears to come.

As the initiative to form the Housing Corporation comes to a close, I will be leading the effort to begin a capital campaign to address the other priorities of the Alumni Chapter. I believe that this endeavor will serve to extend the reach of the Memphis Alumni Chapter and energize the alumni community, especially in light of the changes that will come forth on the heels of the Housing Corporation. As always, we are looking to connect with alumni who have been dormant for many years and want to get involved in some way, be it in a mentor capacity, an advisory role, or even to share their story as a Sigma Nu. 
