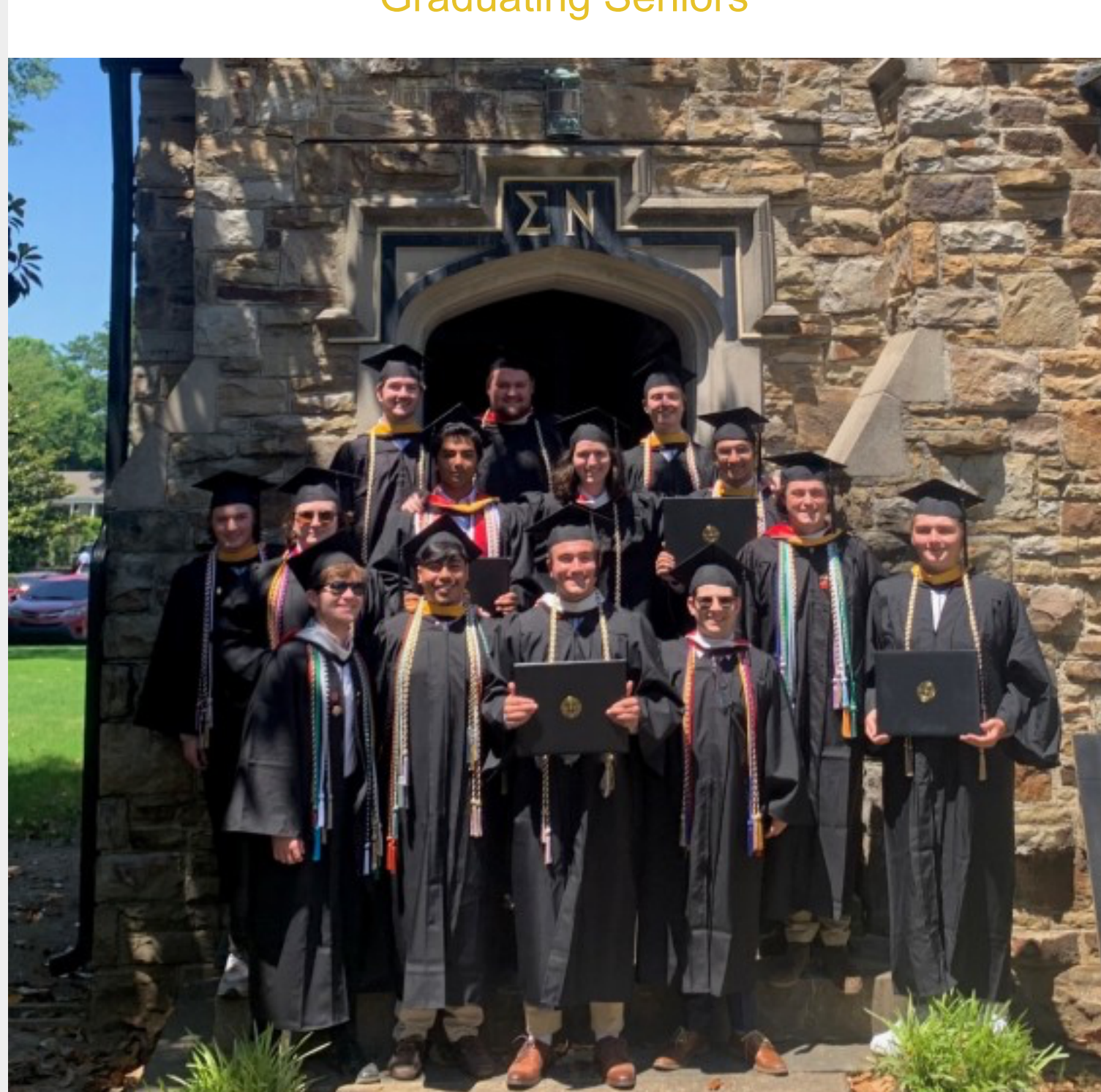
Homecoming Party on Saturday, November 2nd from 11am to 4pm at the Sigma Nu House.
